TLT CLASS OF 2021 HONORED

This past May, 41 students concluded their participation in our seven-month Tomorrow's Leaders Today (TLT) program. Due to the pandemic, a private dinner event was held to honor these graduates – however, we recorded the event and it can now be viewed at www. LeadershipLackawanna.com. With great pride, the TLT Program is graciously underwritten with the corporate support of NBT Bank.

TLT develops the leadership, interpersonal and managerial skills of high school juniors ad ultimately helps to shape future generations of leaders. While in TLT students participated in real-world experiences in the areas of philanthropy, nonprofit organizations, STEAM, financial literacy and health care. They attended monthly sessions, reviewed grant proposals, participated in a variety of seminars, activities and presentations and networked with other area teens. These 41 graduates have completed a one-of-a-kind, elite leadership and professional development program unavailable to most area teens.

Additionally, our TLT participants collaborated with 11 local nonprofit organizations and invested hours exploring how they enhance and impact our community every single day! They also helped award \$8,000 in grant money to four nonprofit organizations because of a unique learning experience sponsored by the Scranton Area Foundation.









This Winter, Leadership Lackawanna launched a new program called Leadership Fundamentals (LF) 2.0. This virtual, eight-week course provided current and aspiring leaders with an innovative and flexible online learning experience – complete with a variety of personal and professional development skills. Participants worked on course content at their own pace while participating in weekly Zoom meetings. The program was graciously sponsored by Allied Services, Penn East Federal Credit Union and PNC Bank. Thirty-six individuals from a diverse make-up of private and public sector businesses and organizations constituted the inaugural members of this new program.

Governor and Mrs. Scranton are considered Founders of Leadership Lackawanna and credited with holding the initial fundraiser that raised \$15,000 in seed money to start our organization. The H. Leigh Woehling Leadership Lackawanna Fund was established to honor the late H. Leigh Woehling, a co-founder of Leadership Lackawanna. Each year it is awarded to an incoming participant aspiring to become an emerging leader.
