CORE PROGRAM CLASS PROJECTS HAVE AN IMPACT OF OVER \$55,000

With great success, the Class of 2022 is proud to announce the results of their class projects. As part of the Leadership 10-month Core Program experience, participants devote a large portion of their time to develop and implement community projects, hence enhancing their leadership abilities, fostering teamwork and benefiting local nonprofit organizations. Leadership Executive Director, Nicole Morristell, commented, "I am so proud of the Core Program Class and firmly believe their projects will not only impact our community forever, but have left a lasting impression on each participant. In total, these four projects had a combined community investment of over \$55,000. Talk about a great year!"



Camp Freedom – Camp Freedom is an outdoor adventure healing camp located in Carbondale, PA that serves Veterans, First Responders, their families, and Gold Star families. The facility consists of over 1,800 acres, 26 miles of which, are hiking trails. Our team assisted in developing a more user-friendly trail and mapping system to provide easier navigation and accessibility for all who experience the beauty and splendor of this amazing facility. More specifically, our team cleared and blazed miles of hiking trails, installed 96 signs throughout camp, and clearly labeled several ponds, hunting blinds, and food plots. In addition, our team held an awareness walk at the camp, not only to raise funds to help support this effort but to bring additional awareness to this much-needed facility and outdoor space.



Dolly Parton Imagination Library – Leadership Lackawanna worked with the United Way of Lackawanna and Wayne Counties, along with several local Foundations, to launch the Dolly Parton Imagination Library here in Lackawanna County. This international book gifting program mails free, high-quality books to children from birth to age five, no matter their family's income. Our Leadership team focused their work on research, outreach, awareness, development, and training. They also held several pop-up events to bring even more awareness of this initiative to Lackawanna County and date have enrolled over 3,300 local children.



Mercatili-Segilia Park – The Mercatili-Segilia Park is a quaint, community park nestled off Birney Avenue in Moosic, PA. Time has taken a toll on this outdoor space, therefore our team assisted in the revitalization and rehabilitation of the park by completing a variety of tasks and improvements. This included purchasing and waterproof sealing 21 new picnic tables, constructing four new serving tables, providing the park with all new signage, and refurbishing 4 benches with new wood. In addition, the team enhanced the 30-year-old

gazebo by giving it a major facelift – a new roof, new shingles, and new paint! In total, our team, along with 50 other community volunteers, invested more than 100 hours improving this community asset for the citizens of Moosic – and beyond!



NeighborWorks of NEPA – Leadership Lackawanna is thrilled to have assisted in the development, volunteer recruitment, and launch of a new initiative called Cutting with Care. This is a volunteer program that provides free grass cutting and light lawn maintenance to older adults in the Scranton / Lackawanna County area. Not only does this service address a major need, but it allows these adults to stay safe and healthy in their homes, and it boasts pride and respect for the community. Our partner in this initiative was Neigh-

borWorks Northeastern Pennsylvania – a local nonprofit organization dedicated to revitalizing neighborhoods and improving lives by addressing housing needs, resident empowerment, neighborhood revitalization, sustainable homeownership, and public-private partnerships.

PROJECTS NEEDED - SUBMIT AN RFP

The Leadership Lackawanna organization will select multiple projects for the incoming class to work on throughout the program year (October 2022 through June 2023). This year marks the 40th year of the Leadership organization.

For nonprofit organizations and community groups, this invitation to submit an RFP presents an opportunity to use the services of a talented team of professionals. The group can help you with a project you have had in mind, but lacked the human resources to accomplish. At the same time, you can expose a group of established and emerging leaders to your organization's mission and goals. This is a mutually beneficial experience for your agency and these emerging professionals. Projects must have a reasonable scope and budget and cannot include capital campaigns, rebranding/branding/marketing campaigns or raising large sums of money.

EXECUTIVE PROGRAM APPLICATIONS NOW AVAILABLE



The Leadership Lackawanna Executive Program is designed to assist professionals in becoming more engaged in the community, broadening their social network and increasing their overall knowledge of the greater Scranton area.

Applications for the Fall Cohort are due by September 16.

Through weekly sessions, participants meet key business and community leaders and receive an overview of Lackawanna County's history, economic/ political structures, cultural affairs, community events/activities, civic groups, and recreational/leisure amenities. Sessions are conducted one evening per week, for five consecutive weeks, at various locations throughout the community. Each session is held from 5:00-8:00 p.m. and includes cocktails and dinner. The program is open to public and private sector administrators/professionals in an executive level position. Candidates must have extensive industry experience that demonstrates a steady career progression. In addition, candidates must either live, work or play in the greater Scranton area and should possess an interest in learning how Lackawanna County functions.

Special consideration will be given to individuals who are interested in promoting equality. Karen was a participant in our inaugural Core Program class. The William P. Rinaldi Leadership Lackawanna Fund is awarded to an individual who works in the field of education and displays the same passion of the late William P. Rinaldi in education and all aspects of life. The fund was established by the Voluntary Action Center and the Leadership Alumni Association. Bill was a Core Program Class of 1984 graduate. The William W. and Mary L. Scranton Leadership Lackawanna Fund shall be awarded annually to an individual who has displayed leadership qualities with a giving spirit to the community. Governor and Mrs. Scranton are considered Founders of Leadership Lackawanna and credited with holding the initial fundraiser that raised \$15,000 in seed money to start our organization. The H. Leigh Woehling Leadership Lackawanna Fund was established to honor the late H. Leigh Woehling, a co-founder of Leadership Lackawanna. Each year it is awarded to an incoming participant aspiring to become an emerging leader.
