40 STUDENTS GRADUATE FROM TLT

Our youth program, Tomorrow's Leaders Today (TLT), recently celebrated the end of the 2021-2022 program year with a ceremony held at the Hilton Scranton. The TLT program develops the leadership, interpersonal and managerial skills of high school juniors and provides real-world experiences in the areas of financial literacy, health care, STEAM, philanthropy, non-profit organizations, and community service. Throughout the program, students were engaged in a variety of sessions facilitated by local organizations serving the Greater Scranton area. In addition to invaluable lessons in the program focus areas, students were given the unique opportunity to engage with business leaders and network with students from 15 local schools. Their program culminated with the allocation of \$8,000 in grant money from the Scranton Area Foundation to 4 deserving local non-profits that were selected by the students. In addition, the class completed a presentation project based on small group interviews conducted with 14 local non-profit organizations. NBT Bank is the corporate sponsor of TLT.

Leadership Collegiate is a six-week virtual course, consisting of online modules, that provide current and aspiring leaders with an innovative and flexible online learning experience – complete with a variety of personal and professional development skills that are ideal for building a solid resume and honing leadership, interview and career readiness skills.

Launched in the Fall and due to much success, we offered this program again for the Spring semester. Seventeen students from six different institutions enrolled in the course and explored a variety of thought-provoking topics including personality, managing differences, emotional intelligence, personal brand, communication, conflict management, decision making and writing emails for impact and influence. Participants worked on weekly course content at their own pace and Zoomed once a week as a class. In addition, the use of a private LinkedIn group allowed the class to network, share comments, and compare homework assignments. 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
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
