FLEXIBLE ONLINE LEARNING

Leadership Collegiate is a six-week, virtual course consisting of online modules that provide current college students who are aspiring leaders with an innovative and flexible online learning experience.

Participants improve their personal and professional development skills while building a solid resume and honing leadership, interview, and career readiness skills. Topics may include the power of personality, managing differences, emotional intelligence, personal brand development, authentic leadership communication, conflict management, and resolution, decision-making, and writing emails for impact and influence.

Participants work on weekly course content at their own pace and Zoom once a week as a class. In addition, the opportunity to connect with students from all over the state and build connections via a private LinkedIn group is plentiful. This program is co-facilitated by Leadership Lackawanna and 68 Rising Leadership Consultants Dr. Matthew Sowcik and Annie Muscato. CORE PROGRAM CLASS OF 2024 SELECTS COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS

LEADERSHIP THROUGH SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

A key aspect of each Leadership Lackawanna Core program class is the opportunity for participants to expand their knowledge of local organizations and hone leadership skills through participation in a small group project. This year, we are proud to announce our collaboration with the following five fellow nonprofit organizations:



THE ANTHRACITE BICYCLE COALITION

By partnering with the Anthracite Bicycle Coalition, our team will recondition bicycles, foster a sense of community, and encourage people to share their love of cycling with each other. In essence, we are contributing to the construction of the very first bicycle kitchen in NEPA. A bike station will be constructed at Connell Park in Scranton, and ABC volunteers will be provided with additional tools and bike stations to continue their work in the community.



THE LACKAWANNA HERITAGE VALLEY

In line with the Lackawanna Heritage Valley's commitment to involve the community in the conservation of regional history and natural resources, we aim to help establish a sensory trail at the Parker Street Trailhead in the Green Ridge section of Scranton. This designated area will incorporate a picnic area, sensory garden, and educational space. Our goal is to create an environment that promotes inclusivity and establishes a connection between people and the natural surroundings of Parker Street, hence, ensuring enjoyment for generations to come.



THE CATHERINE MCAULEY CENTER

The Catherine McAuley Center has recently added a new property to their shelter program. The property has a large space that will be used as a gathering area for families. This property is more than a shelter, it is a safe haven that empowers families to rewrite their narratives with resilience and hope. Leadership Lackawanna will slightly remodel the room with upgraded fixtures, fresh paint, furniture and therapeutic play items to allow families to reclaim a sense of unity and belonging. We want the space to reflect a commitment to ensuring every family, no matter their circumstance, is treated with respect and provided with the support needed to rebuild their lives.



THE OUTREACH CENTER FOR COMMUNITY RESOURCES

Leadership Lackawanna is supporting Outreach's Young Adult program by transforming a new space in their building. This area will focus primarily on health and wellness and feature gym equipment, yoga mats, and outdoor sports supplies. The team will also be providing workout plans, health subscriptions, healthy meal plans, recipes, and cookbooks and general resources to ensure that the environment is both engaging and sustainable.



THE WAVERLY COMMUNITY HOUSE

Our team will work with the Waverly Community House to refurbish the Scout Room, a versatile multipurpose space used for various activities, from yoga classes to community meetings and film screenings. The current state of the room is outdated and inadequate for the community's diverse needs. The project involves essential tasks such as historically appropriate wall painting, new flooring, ceiling tiles, furniture upgrades, mood lighting, and archival photo displays. The three small closets within the room will also undergo an overhaul. The Waverly Community House is a longstanding institution with a mission to enrich the lives of individuals and families through educational, recreational, and cultural opportunities.

LEADERSHIP FUNDAMENTALS 2.0 TAKES OFF

ADVANCING LEADERS IN A BUSY WORLD

Our Leadership Fundamentals 2.0 Level Program, which is graciously sponsored by **Noble BioMaterials** and **FNCB Bank**, is a virtual course providing leaders with all the fundamentals of leadership – but at an advanced level. Program topics include prioritizing purpose, re-framing, humility, running effective meetings, generational differences and workplace diversity. 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
