# SPRING SESSION OF WELCOME SCRANTON!

ANNOUNCED

Welcome Scranton! is designed to give participants a quick, but thorough, understanding of Scranton and Lackawanna County, along with a revitalized sense of putting leadership into action. It can be considered a "gateway" experience to our area, from established leaders seeking more civic engagement to rising professionals ready to take their place as leaders. Each Welcome Scranton! class is comprised of a diverse group of leaders including executives, young professionals, managers, entry-level professionals, business owners, nonprofit directors and senior business officials. New residents of the region should also apply; however, lifelong residents can receive a wealth of benefits, too!

Welcome Scranton! is a 2 ½ day program. Sessions will be held Tuesday, April 14 (1/2 day – PM), Wednesday, April 22 (1/2 day - AM), Monday, April 27 (full day) and Friday, May 1 (1/2 day - PM). Tuition is \$600, which includes transportation, materials and a celebratory "graduation" event. A limited amount of partial scholarships are available based on need. ## CORE CLASS OF 2020 UNITES WITH 5 LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS











The Griffin Pond animal shelter team will construct a clinical room for minor procedures at Griffin Pond Animal Shelter. This room will allow minor procedures to be completed in-house rather than sending animals to an off-site clinic, reducing costs for the shelter. Additionally, an on-site clinic room will alleviate the stress that animals incur during transportation.

The YMCA team will assist the YMCA's Early Learning Center by providing enhancements to the existing play area which is currently designated for riding tricycles. The enhancements include creating a track for the preschool-aged children to ride tricycles and multi-themed decorations for the playground located in the front of the facility.

The Valley Community Library team will provide the citizens of Peckville and surrounding communities with an interactive and educational outdoor garden maze. Each year the garden will rotate its assortment of flowers and vegetables. The space will be fully accessible, Eco-friendly and sustainable for years to come.

Members of the Catherine McAuley Center team will create a safe, positive outdoor learning and activity center in the backyard of the house. This will encourage social interaction and physical activity experiences for children and families served by the Center.

The West Scranton Community Development team's goal is to update and transform space within the facility to a fitness studio, which will offer yoga, dance, and Zumba classes. Updates will be made to the flooring, lighting, and mirrors, as well as fresh paint and many other exciting improvements. A ribbon cutting event is scheduled for Tuesday, May 26. Attending guests will get a tour of the new space and can participate in various fitness classes.
